

MAPPING CANADA: CHECKLIST

DUE: Thursday, DEC. 14

General Directions

1. Read ALL directions for each section before labeling your map. To complete this map, you will need *Ultra fine-point Sharpie markers in red, black, blue, brown, and dark green* along with a box of colored pencils and a ruler.

2. All labels should be made horizontally inside the item or, if it won't fit, connected with a straight line from the label to the item. Labels with lines connecting to the spot can be put in the ocean or in the margin. No lines should cross over other lines. However, rivers and mountain range labels may follow the river/range. Do not write a label over or through another label.

3. MAPS to use – Textbook p. 109, 600; Atlas

Borders

Shade the U.S. side of the U.S./Canada border using a brown color. Also shade Greenland and any other non-Canadian land a brown color.

Provinces and Territories (CAPITALS and Cities)

1. Lightly shade each province/territory using different colored pencils. Alternate colors so that no provinces/territories touching each other have the same color.

2. Then label the provinces/territories using an Ultra fine-point black Sharpie. Do not write the name of the province/territory over the location of the capital since you will be labeling that too.

3. Mark each capital city with a small red star and label the name of the city using an Ultra fine-point red Sharpie. Write small because the province/territory name should be written larger than the capital.
