General Directions

1. Read ALL directions for each section before labeling your map. To complete this map, you will need *Ultra fine-point Sharpie markers in red, black, blue, brown, and dark green* along with a box of colored pencils and a ruler.
2. All labels should be made horizontally inside the item or, if it won't fit, connected with a straight line from the label to the item. Labels with lines connecting to the spot can be put in the ocean or in the margin. No lines should cross over other lines. However, mountain range labels may follow the range. Do not write a label over or through another label.
3. MAPS to use – Textbook p. 248, 255, 261, 274, 287; Atlas

Countries and Capitals

- Lightly shade each country using different colored pencils. Alternate colors so that no countries touching each other have the same color.
- Shade all non-European areas with a brown colored pencil.
- Then label the countries using an Ultra fine-point black Sharpie. Do not write the name of the country over the location of the capital since you will be marking that too. Note: There is a numbering system for small countries. Just write the number where the country is located instead of the country name. The key is below this list of other countries.
- Mark the **location** of each capital city with a small red star.
